Dear parents and carers,

In Monday assembly this week, the children and I held a really positive discussion about staying safe online as it is Safer Internet Day on Tuesday 7th February. As part of this discussion, I asked the children the three questions that the day is trying to teach and recorded their answers too. I think that the children's answers help to guide us all towards how we might work together to help them to feel safe online.

What issues really matter to children and young people? Keeping your online identity safe. How to stop people that you don't know from contacting you. How to be responsible online.

What changes do they want to see? People that you don't know should not be able to contact you. You should be able to delete anything that is online about you.

How can we all work together to advocate for them moving forward? Parents and carers know what is being used online. Children could make videos to share their opinions online.

POPCORN CHALLENGE TIPS

Ask your child to choose what they'd like to read. They'll feel more interested in the story if they've picked it out themselves. (And don't worry if they keep returning to the same story, either!)

If you can, turn off the TV, radio and computer. It's easier for both of you to enjoy the story without any other distractions. Sit close together. You could encourage your child to hold the book themselves and turn the pages, too. Take a look at the pictures. You don't just have to read the words on the page. Maybe there's something funny in the pictures that you can giggle about together, or perhaps your child enjoys guessing what will happen next.

Ask questions and talk about the book. Picture books can be a great way to talk through your child's fears and worries, or to help them deal with their emotions. Give them space to talk and ask how they feel about the situations in the story. **Have fun!** There's no right or wrong way to share a story – as long as you and your child are having fun
