Everything that we do at Magdalen Gates Primary School and Nursery is focused on giving every child the best. Awareness of sounds begins in Nursery and Phonics lessons start on day one in Reception and the focus on teaching children to read continues from that point onwards. Children are taught to read for the first 45 mins of every day, I give out books in assembly on Fridays, there's a book club for Key Stage 2, and the KS2 reading ambassadors, Miss Dodson and Miss Vincent make sure that our libraries are stocked with diverse books that represent the children of the school.
